GRANGE TOWN TRAIL

LYMESTONE BOUTIQUE



2.5 miles | 75 mins | Paved / compacted paths

1. Take a right out of Limestone, walking along Kents Bank Road, where you will walk past the first town plaque of **ROYAL BRITISH LEGION** which was previously Grange National Church of England School.
2. Further along Kents Bank Road is **ST CHARLES CATHOLIC CHURCH**. The plaque is within the grounds which suffered bomb damage during the Second World War.
3. The next plaque on this road is **METHODIST CHURCH** which was built on land donated by local benefactor Alexander Brogden.
4. At the end of Kents Bank Road turn left into Grange Fell Road walking approximately for 0.3 miles until you reach **HARDCRAGG HALL** which is now a private residence but was frequently visited by Beatrix Potter, and became the inspiration for one of her characters!
5. Retrace your steps passing the Library again and then onto **ST PAUL'S CHURCH** which was consecrated in 1853.
6. Go past **THE CLOCKTOWER** and continue to walk along Main Street, following the road to the **VICTORIA HALL**. This magnificent civic building opened in 1901 to celebrate Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee.

7. Turn down the hill to the first building on the left which was **GRANGE'S FIRST POLICE STATION**.
8. Cross Main Street and turn right down the Car Park exit to the **NORMANDY VETERANS MEMORIAL GARDENS** situated on the right. This is one of the most historic areas of the town.
9. Cross Into the Ornamental Gardens, walking along in a clockwise direction beside the lake, home to an exotic collection of wildfowl to **PICKLEFOOT SPRING** which has never run dry.
10. Continue along the lakeside path and then turn left out onto the road opposite a garage. Walk along Windermere Road, where there is a plaque describing the history of **EGGERSLACK TERRACE**.
11. Return down Windermere Road and turn left down Lindale Road to the **RAILWAY STATION**. This was built by the Furness Railway in 1872.
12. Turn right and walk along the Promenade.
13. Approximately half a mile along the promenade is the site of a former **PIER**, near a pedestrian railway crossing.
14. Continue to walk along the Promenade until you reach the **TEA ROOMS**. Retrace your steps and cross the railway by the footbridge.
15. Walk up Clare House Lane to Park Road Gardens. The ornate **BANDSTAND** was previously situated on the Promenade and is a popular venue for concerts in the summer.
16. Rejoin Park Road and walk directly ahead to Cross Street.
17. Turn right into Kents Bank Road, where on your right is the **UNITED REFORM CHURCH** which was opened in 1894. Cross the road to return to Lymestone.

Tips: Suitable for all abilities although not step free. Please be aware the low tide exposes vast sands, stay on the promenade and do not venture onto the bay without an accredited guide.
