TOP TIPS



Find a **quiet space** with no distractions



Your preschooler may **walk off and play, they are still listening**, don't be put off to continue reading



Make **sound effects** and **animal noises** for extra giggles




To extend your preschoolers vocabulary, **make statements** about what you see "*The horse is galloping in the field*"



Let your preschooler **take the lead**, helping their speech to develop and giving them space to talk



Letting your preschooler explore the book how they want helps them understand books, encourage them using the book in different ways




