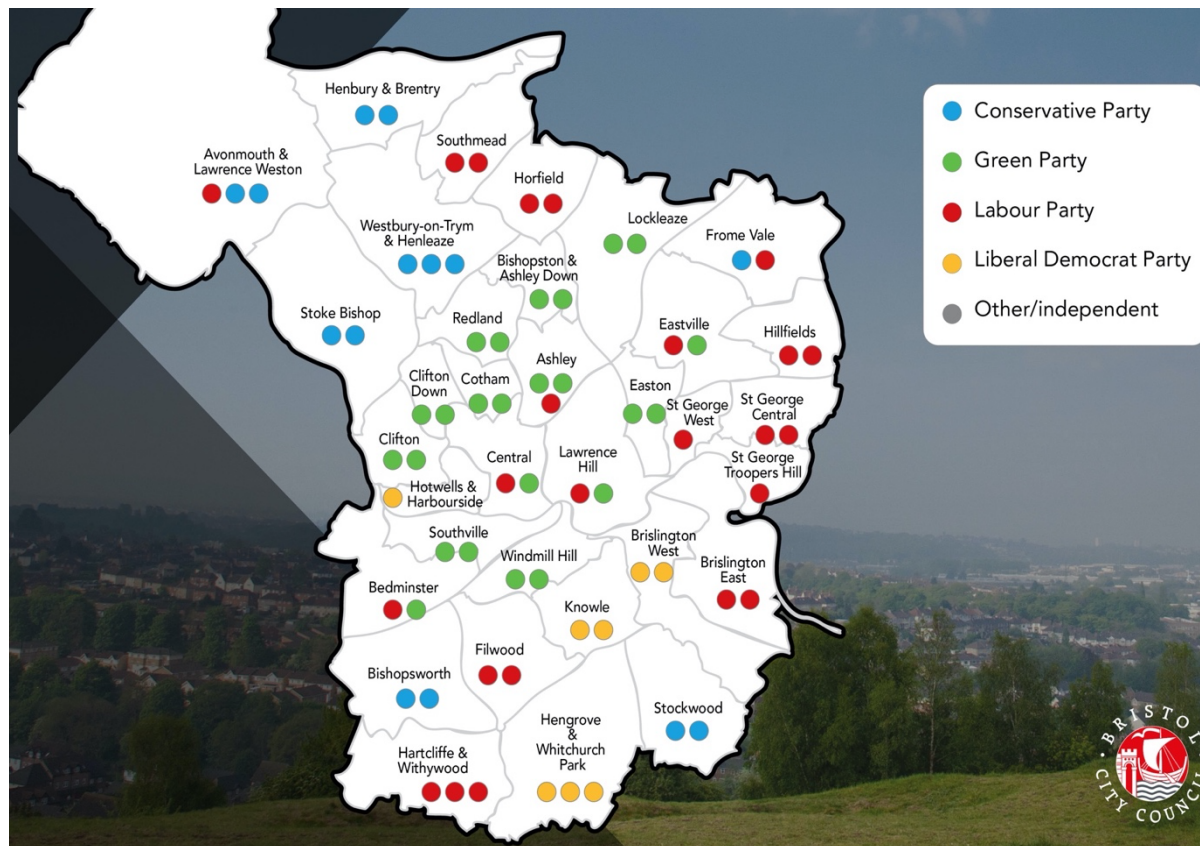


## Green Bristol

In the 2021 local elections the Greens leapt to being the equal-biggest party in Bristol with Labour. Our Green indices shows the key to their success, and where other parties did better.



## "It's the environment, stupid"

Across Bristol the average index value for concern for the environment is a whopping 77 out of 100, whilst concern for animals is a below average 44 out of 100. That the environment has been a key driver of the Green's success is shown by looking at indices at Ward level, selecting the most environmental conscious.

The success of the Conservatives in Westbury-on-Trym and Henleaze is a reminder that elections are not just about one issue, but also keeping local libraries open and the state of the roads.

### “It’s not the animals, smartie”

Ranking by our Animal Protector index shows Labour winning seats in 12 out of the 15 lowest ranking wards, a correlated effect rather than a campaigning issue.

Looking at our non-Green indices it looks like the Greens also stole the economic-left ground. Meanwhile Labour did better than the Greens in the more socially-liberal wards, and those supporting the faster opening-up of the UK from COVID restrictions.

As might be expected the Conservatives won seats in more economically-right leaning wards (average index value of 57 compared to 46 across Bristol), more socially-authoritarian wards (57 to 41) and those with pet-loving animal-protectors.

Traditionally the most environmentally friendly of the big 3 English parties the Liberal Democrats failed to pick up those votes.
