

Dear Parent/Carer,

Thank you for your ongoing support of your young people and the school as we continue to progress through a busy and productive term. Please see an update on a number of matters below:

COVID-19 procedures

Families will no doubt be aware that we all must remain vigilant in dealing with the current pandemic. As a reminder, the best way of ensuring we can avoid contact tracing involving school pupils is to ensure that no one comes into school if they, or anyone in their household has COVID-19 symptoms. If this is the case, the household should isolate, and the symptomatic person should seek a PCR test. Similarly, I would encourage pupils to continue to participate in the Lateral Flow device COVID-19 testing programme. Again, if a positive LFD result occurs, that person and their household should isolate and a PCR test should be booked for the person testing positive on the LFD test. Please inform the school whenever there is a positive LFD test, as we will begin contact tracing at that point. Please also continue to encourage young people to bring a face covering to school.

Lateral Flow Device testing kits

As noted above, Lateral Flow Device COVID-19 testing is important in helping to keep our school community as safe as possible. Pupils participating in the programme and who have given consent, are invited to take a testing kit home over the summer break, in order that they can carry out tests in the week prior to their return in August. We will remind pupils of this nearer the time. Please remember that access to LFD testing is now open to all, with further details on how to access this available from the link below.
