## 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Christmas A 2026

**May God be pleased to fill the world with His glory.**

In 2006, the Church in England & Wales responding to developing universal norms transferred the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord on the Sunday falling between 2<sup>nd</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> January. In 2017, the Bishops of England & Wales, having heard requests from many people in the territory, petitioned and received Vatican approval to move the Epiphany of the Lord back to its proper day of 6<sup>th</sup> January (unless this day falls on a Saturday or a Monday).

Cardinal Robert Sarah, the Prefect of the Congregation for Divine Worship said, *'The Bishop's Conference is to be lauded for taking this decision which goes to underline the importance of liturgical time. Many people will no doubt rejoice that they can once again mark this day as they had been marked until 2006.'*

The Epiphany of the Lord is a Holy Day of Obligation, and in the Farnham & Ash Hub, these will be the Masses for this Feast of the Manifestation of the Lord's Divinity:

- A Vigil Mass at 7pm on Monday 5<sup>th</sup> January in St Joan's.
- Mass of the Day at 9.30am on Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> January in Holy Family, Heath End.
- Mass of the Day at 11am on Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> January in St Joan's.
- Mass of the Day on Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> January at Holy Angels, Ash. [www.holyangels.org](http://www.holyangels.org) for Mass time.
- And a Mass for St Polycarp's School.

Last year on the Feast of St Joan (30<sup>th</sup> May) we celebrated 95<sup>th</sup> anniversary of our Church of St Joan of Arc. This Wednesday, 7<sup>th</sup> January is the anniversary of the Parish of St Joan of Arc, founded in 1932. As Wednesday is my day off, I will transfer the anniversary Mass to Thursday. While we have become part of the new Parish of Guildford this anniversary is still a moment of great significance for our community of faith. Perhaps, we might reflect that the life of the Catholic community has evolved and changed many times over the years, through recusant times, to its reestablishment in Frensham and later as St Polycarp's at Bear Lane in the Town Centre before moving to our current site under the auspices of Fr. Etienne Robo. No doubt, it will evolve again according to the pastoral needs of God's people in these parts.

## **The Baptism of the Lord A 2026**

### ***The Sacrament of Baptism***

Baptism is administered in different age categories.

In the case of children, at least one parent is already a practicing Catholic.

**Infant Baptism 0-6 years:** Ideally, parents will have their children baptised soon after birth. This assumes that there is a reasonable hope that the child will be brought up in the practice of the faith (*measured by the parent(s) attendance at Sunday Mass*). As such, application forms are available from Fr. Simon at the end of your normal Sunday Mass. Once returned, Fr. Simon will arrange to see you to discuss your baptism preparation.

**Children of Catechetical Age 7-13 years:** If a child has reached the age of reason (7+), they are old enough to understand, in part, what is happening to them. Along with their parents, the child needs to consent to baptism and be properly prepared. Again, there must be a reasonable hope that the child will practice their faith. As such, application forms are available from Fr. Simon at the end of your normal Sunday Mass. Once returned, Fr. Simon will arrange to see you to discuss the preparation. The child will be prepared for both baptism and First Holy Communion at the same time, unless pastoral reasons suggest otherwise.

**Adults 14 – 17 years:** From 14, the teenager must make an application to the bishop (*via the Parish Priest*). As we do not have a specific baptism course for this age group, we use the Confirmation Programme to prepare the individual for Baptism, Confirmation and First Holy Communion. This runs once a year, with expressions of interest being taken from September, with the Sacrament administered the following year in early Summer.

**Adults 18+:** An 18month to 2-year process using the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA). It starts with the pre-catechumenate (*lasting six months to a year*), where the individual shows they have already made the Mass and Community part of their life. Then in May, the RCIA course begins (*run as a HUB activity at Holy Angels, Ash*) with the possibility of baptism at the Easter Vigil the following year. If you are thinking of starting the 'pre-catechumenate' or think you are ready for the RCIA course, book an appointment to see Fr. Simon.
